A Word from the Pastor



Dear Friends,

As we move into the difficult days of summer in the desert we also move into a time of conversations about the events and decisions made at our annual conference held June 13-16 in Mesa, Arizona. I hope you will be able and willing to join me for one or two sessions of open conversation about these matters and anything else that is on your mind on two Sundays: July 14 and August 4 after worship. I invite you also to consider signing up for one of four sessions I will lead on "Living Faithfully: Human Sexuality and the United Methodist Church." We will consider topics like "Is Homosexuality incompatible with Christian teaching?" and end with "Where are we now?" That last session will give me opportunities to share with you some of the legislation approved at annual conference.

I have preached on the decisions made at the special General Conference in February 2019 to adopt the Traditional Plan, which reinforces and strengthens the stance of our Book of Discipline to forbid "Self avowed, practicing homosexuals" from ordination and to forbid UM pastors from conducting same sex marriages. This plan, which will go into effect January 1, 2020, requires Boards of Ordained Ministry to investigate the sexual orientation of candidates and requires bishops to investigate any charges brought against a clergy person strictly on the basis of fact and "law" (The Book of Discipline), instead of allowing them pastoral authority to decide how to proceed. Penalties are severe.

However, our annual conference, and many of our clergy and churches, long ago made a commitment to oppose policies they prayerfully discerned were exclusionary and not biblical. Some churches have become reconciling churches, indicating their willingness not just to welcome LGBTQ friends but to have them in leadership as clergy and to allow pastors to perform weddings for same sex couples. Our conference Board of Ordained Ministry decided not to ask about sexual orientation as part of their process of discernment for ordination. As a result we now have 12-15 persons serving as clergy in our churches who have declared themselves to be "self avowed, practicing homosexuals." Some are married. A gay deacon was ordained at annual conference this year.

And our Western Jurisdiction has taken similar stances, including the consecration of a lesbian bishop who serves the Western Sky conference and who is married to a woman.

Meanwhile many of the members of our churches may be wondering what the fuss is all about, and why we are not following the Book of Discipline.

It is a difficult moment in our history. Much of the legislation approved at conference was meant to oppose various aspects of the Traditional Plan. One resolution condemned the plan and apologized to our LGBTQ siblings for the harm it has caused in their community. We will be looking for ways to share with you the effects of this legislation, some of which is technically complex. I also want you to know that 10 teams have been formed to explore various aspects of defining a "Way Forward," including separating from/disaffiliating from the "United" Methodist Church.

There will be a special meeting of the annual conference on September 14 to further consider the "Way Forward."

Please hold our Bishop, the Program and Appointive Cabinets, your pastors, and all the clergy and lay delegates to conference in your prayers as we move forward in a challenging moment toward all God has for us to do and be, together.

Greetings Heartsavers & Ushers,

We now have a portable First Aid Bag you can grab and take with you for those incidents that occur anywhere, that could be the parking lot, the courtyard or on our church campus.

The portable First Aid bag will be stored right next to the First Aid cabinet on the Mailroom wall on a walker (along with the basin which has a blanket in it).

This bag is RED and contains the following:

One Side pocket: tablet, pens and Event Log, First Aid Response half sheet indicating supplies used, and plastic trash bags
2nd Side pocket: cleansing wipes, Inside: Gloves: small, medium, extra large, Adhesive wrap – 2 sizes, Scissors, Paper tape
Instant Cold packs, and a zip lock bag for ice, Blood Stop packs, and multiple travel size Kleenex packs, Gauze pads various sizes, 2” roll bandage, large bandaids, Wound wash - liquid and foam, Aloe Vera cooling burn gel, Purell hand sanitizer, Alcohol pads, & Lubricant eye drops. Please check the bag out and if you see something which might be helpful and we could add to the bag, please let us know. Please take a minute and familiarize yourself with the supplies in the bag and their placement.

Please join me in thanking the Trustees for purchasing the bag.

It is recommended that Saturday Worship Heartsavers pick up this bag and have it available for the Chapel service. On Sundays, the Heartsavers can place it on a window seat in the Sanctuary foyer/narthex where it is readily available. Ushers can also offer First Aid.

When supplies are used, it will be necessary to fill out the First Aid Response sheet and turn in to the office for supplies to be replenished. Heartsavers are required to fill out the Event Log also.

Thank you for your willingness to serve as a Heartsaver and Ushers. The July Heartsavers' schedule is now posted. In addition to the July Worship services, please consider being a Heartsaver for the July 7, Church Picnic (Fellowship Hall). Be sure to purchase your ticket!


CHRISTIAN EDUCATION



HEARTSAVERS HEALTH & SAFETY TIP: "Vial for Life" & "File of Life"

A reminder of a supportive service provided by Sun Health in partnership with Banner Boswell and Banner Del E. Webb Medical Centers volunteers: The "Vial of Life" and "File of Life." The Vial of Life is a pill bottle containing your medical information and stored in your refrigerator. If emergency personnel are called out to your home, they will look for it in your refrigerator and have access to your valuable information. These are available at reception desks at the hospital and most doctor offices. The File of Life is your medical information on a flash drive. The pre-formatted emergency medical form can be accessed at www.sunhealth.org/personal-health-record, click on Resources. Attach the flash drive to your keychain for people on the go. 

Michelle Flood


Michelle is an RN in the ER Department and is pursuing her Masters degree in Nursing Management.
