

in the Chapel



Words from Pastor Deborah

I am surprised as always to discover that Easter is just around the corner. It always sneaks up on me!

In preparation for this most holy season of the church year, I hope you will plan to join us for a **Prayer Vigil on Thursday, March 30**. Come and pray for yourself and for our church, that our hearts will be touched by the difficult reality of Jesus' death and our spirits will then be renewed by the joy of Easter morning. We hope to pray by name for each person and family who call this church "home." It is a deeply moving experience.

Our theme for Easter this year is "*A Lot Can Happen in Three Days!*" As we move through Holy Week, we will remind ourselves first of Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem and remember the conflict that arose almost immediately with the religious authorities there. We will walk the **stations of the cross** in the courtyard sometime during the week. We will share a meal with Jesus on Thursday as we remember his last moments with his followers, gathering at 4 PM for a **dramatic re-enactment of The Last Supper**. **On Good Friday**, we will experience some of the darkness that followed, as we walk with him to the cross and experience the grief and loss of his death. The service of Tenebrae, of darkness, will also begin at 4 PM.

It is from that context of darkness and despair that we will encounter the joy of Easter, reminding ourselves that nothing can ever defeat the power of God to bring light and life and hope, not even a cold dark tomb. Together we will sing alleluias as the trumpets ring out to sound the truth: Christ is risen! Christ is risen indeed!

I hope you won't miss any of it. Gather with us throughout the week as we remind ourselves who and whose we are, acknowledge the price that was paid to set us free, and celebrate the eternal hope that is ours.

We know that in the post-Easter days, many of you will be packing up and heading "back home," wherever that is for you. We will send you with prayers and a fervent hope that we will see you again soon. Know that you will be missed.

But whether you stay to face another scorching Arizona summer with us, or head to cooler climes, my invitation to you as your pastor is to keep Easter on your mind as you move into the more "ordinary" days of your lives. What difference might it make to you to remember, always, that you were bought at a price and that no matter how difficult today, or any day may be, God is always at work to bring new life and hope out of darkness and despair?

A lot can happen in three days. And it did, and it does, and it always will. He is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia! Amen!

Worship Survey Results



A FEW NOTES ABOUT THE WORSHIP SURVEY RESULTS

Thank you to all who participated in our worship survey in February. Your responses at “a point in time” during worship have been very helpful as we seek to set the best course going forward. The immediate cause for doing the survey was to help us make decisions about changing the worship time for the summer, which makes our advertising and communication to the public (and to us!) difficult. Here are a few of the things we learned (with the caveat that this was not scientifically designed nor tabulated.)

Worship time preferences:

38.7% of those responding (84 total persons)	indicated preference for	9 AM
35.5% of those responding (77 total persons)	indicated preference for	10 AM
3.2% of those responding (7 persons)	indicated preference for	9:30 AM
10.6% of those responding (23 persons)	indicated preference for	11 AM

When all of these are considered together

49.3% (107 total persons) preferred a time later than 9 am

Only 3.2% (7 total persons) preferred a time as late as 11:00

CONCLUSION: Our “Sweet spot” for worship among those already attending is 10 AM

Responses from the choir (our worship servants) are in agreement with this conclusion.

Out of a total of 217 persons responding to the Time Preference question, only 12 indicated they are 55-65 years old. This is of great concern for our future.

Only 3 of the 12 in the 55-65 age group marked they usually attend at 11. None of them indicated that this was their preferred time. **Since this service was geared to reach “baby boomers,” it appears that we are not currently reaching our target for this service, and that time may be a significant factor.**

Worship Style Preferences

Only 13.3% of those in the 55-65 age group (total 15 for this question -very small sample size) prefer traditional worship. 60% prefer “blended”, another 20% prefer informal.

In the 66-75 age group,	(58 responding)	36.2% prefer traditional,	36.2% prefer blended
In the 76-85 age group	(139 responding)	45.3% prefer traditional,	38.1% prefer blended
In the 85 -> age group	(46 responding)	67.4% prefer traditional,	21.7% prefer blended)

Our current 11:00 AM attenders are almost all winter visitors, making it unlikely that we would ever be able to continue this service through the summer

These results will shape our planning for the future together, including our planning for the fall schedule. Again, thanks!

Very important!! I want to thank the congregation for helping us with our two most recent projects: the stationery supplies for the residents at UMOM and the Easter Baskets for the children served by Valley View Food Bank. We could not have done such a terrific job if it was not for your help.




This class meets **at 10:30 AM** in the Fellowship Hall Meeting Room. Rev. Russ will facilitate this series in the Sunday Connections class.



SHUMC NURSING SCHOLARSHIPS

The newly named **Endowment and Planned Giving Committee** is happy to report the donation of \$20,000 to Sun Health Foundation for **Nursing Scholarships**. This is an on-going program that supports nurses currently working at Banner Del Webb Hospital to continue their education toward a Bachelor's Degree in Nursing. It is the goal of the hospital to have all of their nurses certified with a BSN.

SHUMC provides the funding and the hospital selects those nurses who apply and are currently studying to complete their education. The amount that has been donated will support ten students through the spring semester. The Endowment and Planned Giving Committee is committed to sending an additional \$20,000 for the Fall Semester. Funds have long ago been donated to SHUMC Foundation and designated specifically for Nursing Scholarships. The committee is responsible for protecting the fund and investing it wisely, so that it will continue to be viable.

Missions Activities

REPORT OF MISSIONS TEAM ACTIVITIES FOR 2022

The SHUMC Missions Team thanks the congregation for its generosity in responding to requests for contributions during 2022. This is a church of great compassion and kindness to help others in need. The Missions Team takes care in spending funds that are contributed by members and friends of the church.

Highlights of Missions Team activities for 2022:

- Considerable amounts of food were contributed monthly and for Souper Bowl Sunday to benefit the Valley View Food Bank and St. Mary's Food Bank.
- An average of 50 loaves of bread was made into sandwiches each week for clients of Justa Center, which is a day program for homeless senior citizens.
- Members of the congregation partnered with the Sun City West Prides to glean citrus in the spring. Countless pounds of the fruit were donated to St. Mary's Food Bank.
- A very large amount of underwear and socks were contributed during Undie Sundays. The recipient agencies were UMOM, Wesley Centers and Valley View Food Bank. UMOM clients are families, single women and veterans who need shelter and supportive services, such as job training. Wesley Centers provide programs such as after-school activities, adult education and health care for low-income families.
- The Easter offering to benefit Wesley Centers resulted in over \$6,000 being donated.
- School supplies were collected for Nadaburg Elementary School and Dysart Community Center. Art supplies were collected for Mary's Place, an enrichment program for people with dementia or Parkinson's, at Benevilla.
- At least 35 members of the congregation and the larger community attended each of seven movies shown during the Summer Movies Ministry.
- Two hundred Kindness Kits were assembled for distribution to clients of Circle the City, a mobile health care program for people facing homelessness. The Kits contained toiletries, snacks and socks.
- Jeans and tee-shirts were purchased by the congregation as Christmas presents for 63 children who attend Dysart Community Center after-school programs.
- A request for financial donations during the Thanksgiving/Christmas season resulted in a contribution of over \$5,500 to Valley View and St. Mary's Food Banks.
- Hundreds of newspaper coupons were collected for the Coups for Troops project and sent to U.S. military bases in Japan and Germany to help military families stretch their dollars.

Habitat for Humanity is a global non-profit housing organization working in local communities throughout the United States and in more than 70 other countries. Families can apply for home ownership by demonstrating ability to repay a mortgage and to invest many hours of their own labor in building or renovating a home. The Mighty United Methodist Coalition works with Habitat and has built many homes in Maricopa County and is now starting a home in Glendale.
