As we finally move into a seasonal shift, with at least some temperatures below triple digits, we also move into a season of change at our church. Over the last year an "ad hoc" leadership group has been meeting to consider how we best face the future with a vital and growing church. Most recently, as we reviewed our declining attendance and membership figures, we realized that we needed to kick it into high gear as we focus our attention on reaching into the world with Christ's love, especially to those aged 55-75. "Baby boomers"


are a little different from many of us. They have high expectations and high standards and expect quality in all aspects of life. They are the first generation to grow up with the levels of choice we now have throughout our lives and culture.

To give us a better chance to connect with the "boomers" around us in the Sun Cities and beyond, we will be making some significant modifications to what we do and how we do it. You will be noticing these changes soon.

- We are upgrading our coffee service by purchasing new commercial coffee brewers and a high grade of ground coffee.
- We are upgrading our hospitality by moving away from foam cups to paper.
- Our informal praise service will allow coffee and refreshment service in the worship area.
- Our Worship team has committed to offering Starbucks level coffee in the narthex and allowing
 it to be taken into the sanctuary. This change will take us a bit longer, but we hope to have it
 going by December 1.
- Our Social Shepherds will be offering a variety of opportunities for outings and short day trips, as well as opportunities around special interests like geo-caching.
- Our finance team will offer a four-part series on topics of interest to newcomers to Sun City West, AZ, including marital property laws and difference in taxation; preservation of assets; and other things newcomers need to know.
- We are upgrading our piano in the sanctuary.
- We will upgrade the screens and projectors in the sanctuary.
- We will update the carpeting and upholstery in the sanctuary and make other changes to enhance our worship.
- New support groups will begin in November, on Monday evenings (the first of several evening offerings, especially for boomers, who are still working).
- Our Missions team will be offering opportunities for mission trips, in addition to new opportunities for "hands-on" and "in-person" ministry locally.
- We will be adding staff to help us re-shape our ministry and assist us as we connect newcomers to areas of interest and community.

It is an exciting and challenging time. Pray for us! Pray for the church! Pray that we keep our focus on the one thing that matters most: sharing Jesus' love with a changing world.

For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven; a time to be born, and a time to die; a time to plant, and a time to pluck up what is planted.

Ecclesiastes 3:1-2

Even as you look towards the future, do not forget to look back, remembering where you were, and celebrating where you are now and the lessons you have learned that have brought you to this point. Take time to be grateful and remember, for everything there is a season!

We are joined by Lord of Life Lutheran Church for this special worship celebration. Come, join us for a Thanksgiving message, prayers, music with our combined choirs; and the chance to welcome our friends from Lord of Life.

We will meet in the sanctuary and move to the Fellowship Hall right after the worship service. You are invited to bring a pie of any traditional Thanksgiving flavor from your own recipe collection, or from your favorite store. Come, come and taste. Come and see what the Lord has in store for us on this day.

REPORT FROM THE CHURCH COUNCIL/LEADERSHIP TEAM

On Wednesday, October 18, 2023, the Church Council met in conjunction with the Leadership Team to hear proposals from ministry teams as how to effectively reach persons 55-75 years of age who live near the church. The Council also heard and voted on funding requests for improvements and initiatives for the same purpose, to be funded from a recent gift the church received. Here are a few of the things covered:

The Missions team is planning a mission trip! They haven't decided where they will go, but are evaluating a short trip to San Diego for communion across the border fence and work at a food bank; a trip to the Sager Brown UMCOR facility in Louisiana, and/or a trip to a reservation in Arizona.

The Social Shepherds are planning to sponsor day trips to fun places in Arizona, outings to museums and places of interest close by, and/or "adult treasure hunting" – an introduction to geocaching.

The Trustees are getting proposals and bids for renewing the sanctuary with new carpet, new pew coverings (these are the original, with fabric over 40 years old and can no longer be cleaned), new paint and a variety of other possible changes to make our worship more vibrant. They are also helping Pastor Deborah evaluate new coffee makers so we can produce better coffee.

The Worship team will be purchasing new paraments and Christmas trees for the chancel. They also plan to offer Starbuck's grade coffee in the lobby of the sanctuary, starting as early as December 2023.

The VEW team is seeking funding for replacement of projectors and screens. They have a little more research to do before moving forward.

The Finance Team will be developing a series of classes aimed at persons new to Arizona/Sun City West. It will include sessions on Arizona laws about marital property, Arizona tax considerations; wills and estates, asset preservation and a compendium of concerns about doing good financial planning.

The SPRC brought three new job descriptions for positions they believe we will need to reverse our precipitous decline in membership and attendance. These include an events developer/planner, a ministry assistant for connection and engagement (both full time) and a half-time marketing and communications manager. All of these will be funded for up to three years from the special gift. We hope by the end of three years they will be self-sustaining, or perhaps not even needed any more!

The music department was granted funding for purchase of a replacement piano for the sanctuary.

It was an exciting moment for our church. We are eager to move into the future with hope as we attend especially to the needs and tastes of younger persons.

STRENGTH AND BALANCE TRAINING

As a Dutch person I find the words "Strength Training" difficult to pronounce correctly. The combination "gth and another t" seems to twist my tongue into a spitting position which just is not done. Therefore I call it Strength and Balance training. We work for an hour on Tuesday and Thursdays.

Our group has morphed into a tight bunch. We help each other put the rubber bands on just so and roll a run-away spiky ball back to its owner. Our instructors name is Bunny, a love of a woman with a great sense of humor. She brings cookies once a month, is concerned about our well-being and encourages us (just try one...). With her bouncing ponytail and variety of outfits, she is our leader par excellence! She has her own method though of getting us to work harder. She counts 1,2,3,4,5,6,7,8,and then 9, 9 1/2, 9 3/4, nine 7/8 until finally she hits the 10!

The first half of our work-out is dedicated to building muscle. She has us growling like bears, arms outstretched and fingers curled while bending forward. Up and down. Our "best" bear is Paul, whose growl can be heard outside the Fellowship Hall! We open and close curtains, stir a witches brew and "walk" front to back in our chair (hold on to your pants)! We shoot arrows, do Jumping Jacks and sing along with Elvis (I think) while doing the YMCA. I have developed biceps and thigh muscles I thought were gone for years, but there they are. Part of that is also due to working with spiky inflatable balls which we clamp and squeeze in the most astounding positions!

The second half is dedicated to practicing our balance. Not our favorite thing but highly needed. We start by standing behind our chair, holding on tight and practice standing on one leg while holding one arm up in the air. I have now progressed to holding on with one finger instead of my fist and that is in part because of Bunny's encouragement. We do the DWI walk (one foot in front of the other), kick the back of the chair because that helps us climb the stairs, do pushups by falling forward against the back of the chair, doing the Downward Dog and finish by standing in front of our chair doing 10 sit-downs-and ups with our arms crossed! (I have mastered five so far} We end our session relaxing with some breathing exercises and then thanking Bunny with a heartfelt NAMASTE!

I often marvel at our endurance. Here we are, all with our aches and pains and disabilities. Some of us come with canes and walkers, others have difficulty stretching and bending, or our backs are not working right (me included), but together we not only have fun but are improving our bodies and with that comes a brighter outlook on life. We all need a little push sometimes and Bunny makes that possible.
