As we move more deeply into the season of Lent, the time of spiritual preparation before Easter, I feel as if I have missed the first few weeks. I'm not sure what bug got hold of me, but it kept me coughing and voiceless for well over a week. I am so grateful to Pastor Daniel for stepping in twice, with little notice, to take up the mantle of worship leadership and preaching. We are deeply blessed by the gifts of our full and part time associate pastors.

On these weeks when I could not come in person, I have worshiped with you by livestream, and that was helpful to me. Now I know better the experience we are providing for those who cannot be with us in person. It was wonderful to see those of you who were in the room when you turned to remind us we

are chosen, blessed, and loved. I felt like you were glad I was there, even if you could not see my face.

And I was struck by how many there were. Our in person worship attendance recently has been better than at any time since COVID - -a real sign of recovery and hope. There is a new and festive mood as people enjoy their good Starbucks coffee (thank you worship team, for your inspiration in this regard) both in the narthex/lobby before the 10 AM service and at our Fellowship Hour. These warm and hospitable gatherings give us space in which we can make newcomers feel welcome and make a place at the table for them.

My real delight is in how many people are joining us for deeper discussions about matters of faith and life in our two Connections classes; one on Sundays at 8:45 AM; the other Wednesdays at 5 PM (new time) with soup and salad after. Between the two we have 40-50 persons gathering most weeks to delve more deeply into how God is calling us forward, individually and as a church. I am deeply grateful to Kathy Culliton and helpers for their willing spirit in providing those meals, which make such a difference in the climate of discussion.

Meanwhile, your leaders continue leaning in to the ambitious plan of ministry we adopted for 2024, seeking to hire new persons to help us reach the world with Christ's love; investigating options for updating our sanctuary, getting the word out through quality advertising and good stories shared with our local community.

I look forward to continuing our walk together toward the cross and resurrection, as we address our doubts and provide a welcome space for anyone to join us and find hope and renewed faith. Please take a moment to look at our Holy Week schedule and make plans to join us in many ways to enrich this holiest time of the Christian year.

HEARTSAVERS



Did you know that SHUMC has a team trained in CPR and has a plan to respond to any emergency that should happen during an event at the church?

Heartsaver volunteers are primarily members and staff who

have been certified by the American Heart Association to respond to someone having sudden cardiac arrest during the first minutes before paramedics arrive. Volunteers are trained in CPR (cardiopulmonary resuscitation) and the use of AED (automated external defibrillator). The goal is to have one or two Heartsaver volunteers available to respond to a medical emergency at each one of our worship services and other major SHUMC events.

We are in need of new recruits! If you are interested in becoming a Heartsaver, please notify Julie Killebrew, Health Education Facilitator. We will be having CPR recertification classes soon and education on the new AED devices that have recently been purchased.



A Wonderful Service Opportunity for SHUMC

Starting April 15, SHUMC will host a ten-week event called, Finding Meaning and Hope: *A Discussion Series For Family Caregivers*. This course is sponsored by Duet: Partners in Health and Aging. It was developed in 2017 to meet the great need of individuals who care for loved ones with dementia. This course focuses on giving the caregivers hope and meaning.

Julie Killebrew has been certified to teach this course at SHUMC. Our desire is to provide respite care during the course for those who would otherwise be unable to attend because they have nowhere to leave their loved ones during this time. We need three to four individuals each week to help watch over and keep these clients safe so their caregivers can attend the class. Please search your heart and pray about helping with this important task.

Please sign up for as many days as you feel comfortable in helping. We will have some general guidelines typed up for the volunteers. No physical care should be required except maybe helping to the bathroom which is located next to the meeting room. ⁵

STATIONS OF THE CROSS

The Stations of the Cross, also known as the Way of the Cross or Via Crucis, commemorate Jesus' passion and death on the cross. There are 14 stations that each depict a moment on his journey to Calvary, usually through sacred art, prayers and reflections. The practice began as pious pilgrims traced his path through Jerusalem on the Via Dolorosa.

The Chapel, will be open Monday-

Thursday, March 25-28, from 9 ÅM until 3 PM. This is a self-guided experience. Come, and make the journey of the Cross with Jesus.



MAUNDY THURSDAY

'Maundy' is derived from the latin 'mandatum' which means basically "commandment." Maundy Thursday services traditionally include a focus on the Last Supper, and in many places, a foot or hand washing

service is included. Today, the stripping and washing of the altar is often an integral part of Maundy Thursday. Either way, Maundy Thursday ends with the starkness of the empty, bare altar. Our souls are bare as well, as we begin to walk through the rest of the weekend.

The new commandment and communion were only introduced this night – it is not yet completed! Jesus was focused on modeling for his disciples (and for us) what servanthood and fellowship could look like. Serving one another, serving the least and the outcast, and seeing ourselves not as masters but as those who serve. Maundy Thursday was only the beginning! We are called to be Maundy Christians every day.

MISSIONS

The SHUMC Missions Team invited the congregation to give financial donations during the 2023 Thanksgiving and Christmas holiday season to support the Matthew 25 Prison Ministry. The response was overwhelming and a check for \$12,483.47 was given to the ministry. The volunteer Prison Ministry provides programs for women in the Perryville Prison located in Goodyear, Arizona and for other youth offenders in Maricopa County.

The Matthew 25 Prison Ministry is based on the scripture of Matthew 25:35-36, 40b: "For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, I was naked and you gave me clothing, I was sick and you took care of me, I was in prison and you visited me...truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me."

One of the Prison Ministry programs offers scholarships for inmates to earn associate degrees through Rio Salado College. The college and the prison system work together to determine recipients of the scholarships. Another program matches female pen pals to female inmates. A third program provides assistance to those who are being released from incarceration. The assistance is in the form of items not provided by the prison system such as a bus ticket, clothing, shoes, toiletries or placement in a halfway house to gain life skills. During the Lenten season, the SHUMC Missions Team has chosen the organization Duet: Partners in Health and Aging to receive our Easter offering.

Duet was started in 1981 by The Reverend Dr. Dosia Carlson and Church of the Beatitudes in Phoenix. Duet is a non-profit, interfaith organization that promotes health and well-being through its free-of-charge services to homebound adults, family caregivers and grandparents raising grandchildren. Duet also introduced the concept to the Phoenix area of congregational health programs led by faith community nurses.

Feeding kids. Feeding spirits. Empowering communities

Since 1987, Feed My Starving Children has given hope to so many in the form of nutritious MannaPack meals to those who are hungry around the world. Every year, millions of children die from preventable causes such as pneumonia, diarrhea, malaria and undernutrition. Hunger is still causing nearly half of deaths in children under 5 years old. Feed My Starving Children (FMSC) believes hope starts with food. As a Christian nonprofit, FMSC is dedicated to seeing every child whole in body and spirit.

FMSC works with food distribution partners that stay with communities for the long haul, empowering them to move from relief to development. Meals are developed by food science and nutrition professionals to supplement nutritional needs and reduce problems with malnutrition. Nutrition allows children to grow, thrive and develop to their full potential.

GRILLING FOR HOMELESS SENIORS

In October 2023, we had the opportunity to host a barbecue for 160 homeless senior citizens at the Justa Center, It was a very rewarding experience to provide our "service and witness" to 160 individuals who graciously received us into their daytime place of refuge and support. Since 2006, the Justa Center has solely focused on older adults experiencing homelessness and provides life-sustaining resources, services, and support to homeless seniors.

UNITED WOMEN IN FAITH EASTER BASKET COLLECTION



Easter is early this year, March 31! SHUMC United Women in Faith will again help provide Easter baskets for underserved children. The following information will help guide the making of the baskets. Please bring the completed baskets on or before the March luncheon on March 7.

WHAT SHOULD THE BASKET LOOK LIKE? EASY ANSWER: FULL!

Basically, there should be little room left. Please put more than one item in the basket. Children don't understand that one expensive item can be worth more than several smaller items.

Please use medium baskets. The Dollar Store has a good size. Remember, all items need to be new. Do not include: toothbrushes, toothpaste, broken or used toys, razors or razor blades or hotel size toiletries.

Chocolate candy melts and causes allergic reactions in some children. Nuts are also allergenic and cannot be donated. Anything that looks "pretty new" or only "slightly" used or anything that looks like or can be used as a weapon should not be included.
